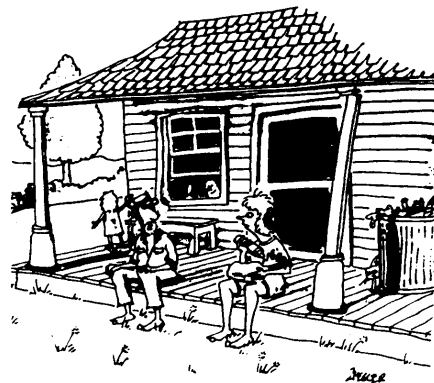

In keeping with the lessons we learned at the US FF Champs in California, I cancelled the contest when the wind reached a maximum of 3 mph. Just kidding the weather was perfect all day.

The contest started with the P-30 fly-off from the May contest between Bill Leppard and Don DeLoach. Don had to rush as we were late in arriving but both flyers were able to get their flights off in the 10 minute window. Sorry that I don't know the times, but the victory went to Don and his trusty Pole Cat.

Once again we had a new flyer come up from Colorado Springs and take all the marbles in HLG. Congratulations to Bill Stevens for his well earned victory. His son Zac also won first place in Jr HLG. That is a sweep for family Stevens. Just in case you don't know the name Stevens, Bill is the proprietor of Stevens Aero Model products. We had two juniors flying in this contest. In addition to Zac Stevens we were also treated to have Doug Myers flying with us. Doug and his dad Neil swept the CLG event. So both of our father and son teams did themselves proud. Both of these boys had a great time and I am looking forward to seeing them frequently on the field. Doug worked as a timer and helped with the score keeping. Thanks Doug.

Three minute rubber and FAI Combo each had one competitor. Bill Leppard put up three maxs with his Gollywolk Chuck Etherington has his F1C flying great. His launches are spot on as the Brits would say. He flew all 7 rounds to a total of 1043 seconds while posting 4 maxs.

Flyers from the Western and Midwestern U.S. were on hand to share three days of beautiful weather at our field east of Denver. In addition to the complete menu of FAI events, we also flew all the National Cup events.

The only flyer to max out in FAI was Don DeLoach in F1J. On the National Cup side, both Tim Batiuk and Todd Reynolds maxed out in HLG (Tim with 11 maxes and Todd with 6). Tim also maxed out in CLG. Don DeLoach bested a field of 9 in Classic Towline, maxing out with his Super Talon. Jim O'Reilly (winner) and Don

DeLoach maxed out in O/T Rubber while Bill Leppard won P-30 with a maxout. Much to my delight, Matt Gewain (winner) and Ed Carroll joined us for F1C making a total of six entries. Rene Limberger won F1A, Eddie VanLandingham F1B & F1G, Peter Brocks F1E, Norm Smith F1H, Don DeLoach Slow Gas Combo & Fast Gas Combo, Jim O'Reilly Nostalgia Wake/Rubber & Moffett. In all there were 406 flights posted with 248 maxes. This contest continues to grow each year.

Friday night saw a fine barbecue at Mel and Karen Gray's clubhouse and Saturday night we enjoyed a stylish banquet at The Perfect Landing, a restaurant that overlooks the ramp and runways at Centennial Airport.

I'd like to thank all who traveled here, participated in and helped with the contest. I'd especially like to thank co-CD Bill Lovins for helping to run the contest and Sue Etherington for volunteering to serve as head scorekeeper. See you all next year.

Contest impressions:

Tim Batiuk: "Well, during my 11 max marathon I had a couple of interesting flights. One was on my second max I was in weak air and never got over 150 high and just wandered around the field. I was pretty sure it was not going to make it, especially when it was low and decided to go over the cars. At around 1:45 it was headed for the top of a motor home and it missed landing on top by inches and landed on the field at 2:12. On my 7th max I launched with Todd and Mark and we all went to Death Valley looking bad. At about 1:20 my glider departed from the other two and wandered to the right barely eking out a max at 2:01...the other two fell short. I guess that I would rather be lucky than good.

In cat glider I really have to give major props to Mark Covington. We were tied with 2 maxes each and on my third max I got a boomer. As my glider was flying away I was desperately trying to start Mel's bike and when it became obvious it was not going to happen I asked Mark for help, because it was one of my best cats and I hated to lose it so close to the Nats. Without hesitation Mark jumped on his bike and took off. I joined him later and we looked for an hour for that blasted thing to no avail. By helping me Mark missed the window to get his last max because the wind came up. This was one of the greatest acts of sportsmanship I have ever seen and Mark was the true winner of Cat that day...just more evidence of MMM greatness! To put a cherry on top of that story Todd found my glider 30 minutes later...what a great group of guys!!

Lastly, more major props to Randy for helping me with my classic towline.

I am eternally grateful to the entire MMM bunch and I can't wait to come back."

Don DeLoach: "The significance of Tim's performance in HLG cannot be overstated. This

was the main memory for me." Also, there was my first fly off flight in OT Rubber. I launched into the biggest thermal of the day, late on Saturday afternoon. I was running out of time and needed two 4-min fly off flights to tie Jim O'Reilly. This first flight went OOS in about 30 seconds at which time I pulled out the radio and tracked it in the air for a mile and a half. It did finally come down—I think the time to the ground was over 6 minutes--and it landed past Pancost's compound in that gravel mine. I parked my bike at a fence line and had to walk nearly a mile further until the signal piqued. The model was in the bottom of the main gravel pit, about 50 feet deep! I still can't believe the signal came through. Anyway, by the time I walked back uphill to my bike I was really tired and, unfortunately, out of time to catch JOR. I was also about to collapse from dehydration. This whole episode took well over an hour. It's flights like those that remind me about the strength of our thermals and also how brutally hot and dry it can be in mid-summer. I almost forgot: Don't overlook Todd's performance in HLG. He did 6 maxes or so! Awesome flying, and it would have been a club record."

Mel Gray: "Well, other than my choking in the last round of FIG and going from the penthouse to the outhouse, my most lasting impressions are from the wonderful performances in HLG by Todd Reynolds and Tim Batiuk. The six maxes by Todd were simply outstanding but eleven maxes IN A ROW by Tim is just phenomenal. I count myself lucky to have been able to witness these two performances. Also, setting up next to Ed Carroll and his friend Mike was a lot of fun the entire weekend. I remember seeing a picture of Ed flying an F1C in a Model Builder magazine from 25 years ago. Although he is suitably serious when flying his high tech F1C airplanes, he is wonderfully cordial and plain fun to be around at a contest. He and Mike were a hoot. Don and I tried to have some fun with Jim O'Reilly and his lost airplane that I found, but he is too wily for us! Speaking of which, missed Ed Wiley at this contest. Hope he is well and can come out for the RMC."

Pete McQuade: "In one of the afternoon rounds on Saturday, Rene Limberger lost his beautiful, four-servo F1A. He picked up some strange, hard-to-track signals on his radio receiver. And Eddie Van Lingham had seen what we all

thought must have been Rene's model landing on DT, in the large valley to the south, by the grain silo. But the radio signals and Eddie's observation didn't seem to agree. So Rene went back to flying his rounds with another model. Later, after the end of flying, Rene, Mike Thompson, and I got on our motorcycles and went off in search of the wayward F1A. We picked up the weak radio signals and, after a circuitous search, eventually found the model. It turned out that Eddie's sighting was pretty close, but something about the way the model sat on the hillside had made its radio signal very "directional" and hard to track. But the model was retrieved and flew again the next day, to become the MMM FAI Annual's 2007 F1A champion."

Randy Reynolds: "My overriding memory was watching Todd and Tim escalate HLG to pretty

high levels. They were both locked up at six maxes apiece when Todd gambled on iffy air because he thought we had reached the end of the afternoon lift with wind building. He later said he probably just grew impatient. Tim went on to record 11 maxes as we all know and there was still good air after he dropped. Tim also gambled on some really turbulent air that felt like a dust devil and unfortunately he got in front of it and dropped.

As I think about all of the classes being flown, HLG is one where there isn't any excess of performance past a max time and thus each flight one has to exceed calm air performance by at least 50-70% in order to max. To do this 11 times is pretty remarkable. Granted the DLG development has made this much more possible but it is still quite the achievement."
