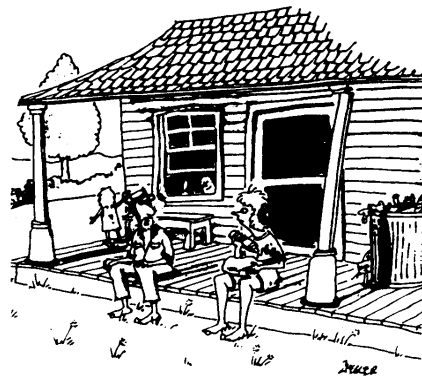
This is our 51st year...so one can ask...are we at a threshold for the club or us a modelers? What will we be or grow into 50 years from now?

Annual Business Meeting Report
December 8, 2007

As usual, we had a snowstorm during the meeting and the drive home was a bit dicey.

I. President's State of the Club (Pete McQuade).

- i) We had a very successful year all around and our club continues to grow.
- ii) The 14-round FAI Annual and the Rocky Mountain Championships enjoyed increased numbers of entries again this year drawing many out-of-state flyers.
- iii) Jerry Murphy was the Outdoor NATs CD and Rob Romash was the Indoor NATs CD this year bringing much notoriety to our club. Thanks for stepping up guys.

2) II. Discussion of monthly contest events by Don DeLoach

- i) It was decided to keep the same menu of events as last year and allow the CD to choose the feature event.
- ii) Paul Andrade was recognized for implementing the season points program and a discussion followed.
- iii) Recap of indoor season.

3) Treasurer's report with handout (Chuck Etherington). 2007 statement of finances are shown elsewhere in this newsletter.

4) 2008 Contest Dates and CD assignments (Pete McQuade) *SEE SCEDHULE IN THIS ISSUE!*

- A. Ruckus in the Rockies was discussed (which contest it might best be combined with). It was decided that Todd Reynolds needs to be part of that discussion.
- B. Dave Wineland's Gas Attack event to be run at the Rocky Mountain Champs.

5) The need for FAI 14-Rounder and RMC management teams was discussed. Members will be contacted and asked to participate on these teams.

6) VI. Flying Field Issues.

- i) Status of the field lease. We have not been billed for two years but our relationship with the Colorado State Land Board remains very good. A meeting with the Lowry Property Manager, Melissa Yoder, is scheduled for Jan 14.

- ii) Long-term search for new flying site - committee needed. The property we are currently on will become a "conservation development" which includes reservoirs, etc., and we will probably not be able to fly there. This will probably be years down the road, however, and we don't need to panic just yet. Mel Gray reported that based on a meeting he attended last year, the ordnance cleanup effort will extend beyond the next five years and development is unlikely before then.
- iii) Maintain good relationship with MMFC/SAM1 and support each other's contests.

7) VII. Club dues/newsletter costs.

- Jerry Murphy discussed electronic newsletter delivery and resulting cost savings.
- Rick Pangell discussed maintaining current email addresses.

8) Current dues structure was voted on and retained.

Jerry Murphy, as newly elected president, asked Pete McQuade to continue to serve as liaison with the Colorado State Land Board.

10) Don DeLoach auctioned off two O/T Rubber kits (Midwest Jabberwock and Dyna Moe). They were donated by an east coast indoor flier friend of Rob Romash who passed away. The proceeds are to be donated to the Junior Indoor FAI Team.

- i) Pete McQuade was the high bidder at \$70 and donated his kit of choice back to the club.
- ii) Marc Sisk then won the kit with his next highest bid of \$65.
- iii) The second kit went to an out-of-state bidder for \$100.

The 2nd annual Pikes Peak Ceiling Climb was quite successful and a lot of fun despite the relatively low turnout of 14 flyers. I attribute this low turnout to the fact that we had little choice in dates this time around, once we found out that our preferred date of March 22-23 was Easter weekend (my fault completely!). January 5-6 is about the worst time of year to expect people to travel to a major meet, but we went through with it anyway. Next year I am going to reserve our dates *much* further in advance. I plan to hold the PPCC sometime in March 2009, with (hopefully) plenty of separation from Kent State and Midwestern States Champs.

For those who showed up, it was a really fun meet. And some great prizes were awarded, thanks to some generous sponsorship. As usual Peck-Polymers/F1D.biz came through in a big way, with the donation of about 15 prizes. Thanks to Tim Goldstein and Tom Norell at Peck for their generosity. Also I would like to thank an anonymous MMM sponsor who, via Roland Solomon, donated some fantastic outdoor FF kits to be used as prizes. Bill Leppard won the Satellite 450 kit and Rob Romash went home with the Galaxie 585. I can't remember who got the Comet Sparky kit. Finally I want to recognize Duane Hjerleid and the estate of Sweeney Hayashi. Duane came down with a bunch of modeling stuff from Sweeney's estate. Some of it was used as prizes and the rest was sold, with 100% of donations going to the Junior FF team. Thanks Duane. Sweeney was a great guy and is sorely missed.

Perhaps the most notable performance of this meet was the pair of 41+ sec flights made by Todd Reynolds in HLG—a site record by a very wide margin. For four years Romash and I have been topping out around the 37-39 sec mark. Then suddenly Todd comes in with two 41.3s. Wow. Todd you are *The King*...congrats!

We used the 5-4-3-2-1 scoring system for Grand Champ—the same as the Chicago Aeronuts use at

the MW Champs. Rob Romash came out the victor for the second year in a row, this time with 17 points and sole possession of the Colorado Cup trophy (last year he tied with Bill Gowen). Romash won 5 events (F1L, UCLG, Std. CLG, LPP, Ministick). Second and third place in Grand Champ were Don DeLoach with 14 points and Bill Leppard with 11 points.

I want to thank everyone who pitched in to make this contest a success, especially those who sat at the table and timed/recorded flights. Teamwork is what makes our club and these meets a success. Thanks to Darold Jones, Jerry Murphy, Mark Covington, Bill Leppard, and Rob Romash. I apologize if I missed anyone who did table duty for any length of time. Last but certainly not least Cindy DeLoach: Thanks from all of us for bringing that outstanding carrot cake on Sunday. It was *truly* delectable!
