


PONDERINGS DEP'T

We only had 8 contestants but those who showed up experienced some of the best flying of the year. The special event was Gollywock and the winner was Duane Hjerleid. Duane won the Campbell William's Moffet short kit and plans for his efforts.

The undersigned was starting to trim out his new Gollywock and finally on its last flight it climbed out like a good Gollywock should. I am always gratified by how well this 70 year-old design goes up with such enthusiasm and purpose. I managed to get the Gollywock into a big boomer and within 2 minutes the little ship was going in and out of eyesight almost directly overhead. With binoculars I was able to keep it in sight for about 10 minutes while Don and Todd gave chase with Tracker in hand. Fortunately gravity won and the Golly was found about 2 miles away. The tracker was the only reason they found the ship as it DT'd in a different direction than eyesight would indicate. This is a 110 gram airplane that flew for at least 10 minutes under full DT. Whew!

The rest of the contest was taken up with trimming airplanes and featured Roland Solomon working out his flight time requirements for the FAI finals. Pete McQuade is very happy with his new F1A, which has been two years in the building. He hung around until late in the day to get more trim flights in but unfortunately the sky clouded over and we had wind and rain get in the way. In HLG Mel Gray used his Meerkat to show the way with a fine max out even though he was tinkering with launch techniques. In spite of all that Mel showed that he still could pick air, which is most important in the little glider events.



TD .020 MESSIAH DEP'T

Extracted from "The Winding Stooage," Hank Sperzel, ed. And email from Don DeLoach

Bob Mattes, 190 Hunters Pointe Dr., St. Charles MO 63304, has developed a head for the TD .020. this may not bode well for all the ebay scalpers. Bob's head is similar to the Galbreath TD .049 head. It adapts a Nelson Flat Coil p-lug, and comes with all that is needed for the plug too.

Here is some of the information posted on his site care and feeding of various engines. For example he recommends only 15% nitro in most Nos engines (and 25% total oil). Only "structurally strong" engines can handle higher nitro.

Nelson Plugs - If you get a Nelson head for one of your engines you will obviously need some Nelson plugs. The are two sources that I use.

Doug Galbreath at <http://www.the-printer.net/DookCat.html>

has Nelson heavy duty plugs and other items for Free Flight. Kitting It Together at <http://kittingittogether.com/> also has the Nelson heavy duty plugs as well as the "Hot" or standard Nelson plugs and the flat coil Nelson plugs. Personally I only use the heavy-duty vertical plugs and the standard duty flat coil plugs. Older versions of the vertical coil heavy-duty plugs have a little notch as shown in corner of the hex of the plug as compared to no notch for the standard Nelson plug. New stock has a glass/epoxy seal and no notches. For the Cox 049 engines and the Holland Hornet Nelson heads can

be economically obtained from Doug Galbreath. For most other engines I will gladly custom make a Nelson head to fit.

Plug Torque - Don't go crazy with the torque you apply to the Nelson plug. 36 in-lb is plenty and do not torque while the engine is hot unless the lift is blowing through. It is a good idea to get a torque screwdriver and use it for torquing head screws as well as the plugs. You usually can get a Utica TS-35 Torque screwdriver on eBay for about \$50 or less. Retail is almost \$300.00.

Bladders – A really neat bladder is something called “The Little Red Cap”. It looks like a condom for a Gerbil and provides a pressure level that is lower than that of a pacifier but higher than for a penny balloon. The lower pressure level makes many of the original needle valve assemblies work just fine and needle adjustment is very easy. It can be cut off slightly longer than any of the various smaller diameter sections and used for engines from 0.020 to the largest you have. If you mount it externally, where the sun can do it's thing, you should protect it with a penny balloon. The Little Red Cap web site is <http://www.littleredcap.com/> along with a list of retailers. Cost is extremely reasonable from Rockler Woodworking at \$5 for 35 caps. Their web site is <http://www.rockler.com/product.cfm?page=5685&filter=little%20red%20cap>. Ace Hardware sometimes has them but they charge way more. I have been using the same bladder on my test stand and they last for many runs. It was discovered by Dick Covalt and we have been using it for three years with excellent results. We don't win more contests but our engines are happy.

EDWARDS FF BASE – 2009 !!

Great News!!!! Jerry and Don met with the Edwards' and we have a new 12 month lease. They are very happy with us and are comfortable with our relationship.

The lease has been renewed for 11/1/08 through 10/31/09.

As they say in Dancing with the Stars, in no particular order Mark Covington, Don DeLoach, Chuck Etherington, Neil Myers, Randy Reynolds, Todd Reynolds, and Rob Romash. In addition Frank Deis of the PPSS club attended and John McGrath of the sport flyers group also spoke. Both Rob and I spoke to the council and in addition I was able to spend some time with Paul Butcher, director of COS Park and Rec. He told me that he was not planning on any major cost increases for non-profits like us.

John presented the sport flyers case with an emphasis on the Wright Stuff program while I presented our case with the benefit to the council that we draw flyers from across the front range and out of state for our championship meet which has a positive impact on sales tax revenue. I gave each council member a flyer for our November 9 session.

I learned a lot about how to deal with government bodies like this from this session. In the future we will be better organized with a group of speakers all making one point and then a last speaker that summarizes all the previous presentations.
