Rumor has it that Gordon is preparing an attack on Dave with renewed building and testing of several new HLG and CLG models, and has also enlisted John Watkins to give it a try.

Gary Oakins has just about completed repairs on his power models, and is ready to build new models soon.

The high point trophy started back around 1956 when Sid Jepson was club president. It has always been the reason to work hard at club contests for amassing points to win the coveted club award.

New Events at the 2010 NATS

For 2010 there will be 2 new events at the NATS.

The first is Vintage FAI power. Any FAI class power model from the 1950s to 1979 is eligible. There are equalizing engine runs for the different periods. So far, it has been flown with 7 second to 20 second engine runs with the 7 seconds allowed run for later models and 20 for the earlier. The 20 seconds is obviously too long for the early models, because even NOS gas models are usually only given 9 second engine runs at most contests. These early models are typically NOS legal (prior to 1956 design). So far this event has only been flown in California in the desert, and the 20 second runs have been reported as being spectacular. This event will be flown at the NATS on Friday, August 6.

The second event is a scaled down Mulvihill event being sponsored by Paul Andrade from Colorado, the NFFS freeflight rubber editor. The intentions are to reduce the model size, limit the amount of rubber to 20 grams, and fly 2, 3, and 4 minute flights for the first 3 flights. Any flyoff flights continue to be 4 minute flights, so the models might stay on the confines of the field. It will be flown on Monday, August 2, and with no entry fee required. This event makes much more sense than the current Mulvihill event in that cross country chases will not be required for getting multi-minute maxes in the flyoff rounds, and the 20 grams (3/4ounce) of rubber will be much less costly than blowing a 1/2 pound motor that costs \$15 a flight. So the rules are, 200 square inch wing area, 20 grams of rubber, locked down flying surfaces (no auto anything other than DT), other Mulvihill rules apply.

Meeting Minutes: Dale Mendenhall reporting

January 8, 2010 15 in attendance

Jim Ladwig brought in items from a variety of activities for distribution among club members. Phantom flash kits were sold and distributed to interested club members hoping that there would be a competition for them when we find an indoor site to hold such. February Auction discussed. Jim Ladwig solicited help for the Sciencd Olympiad to be held at St. Thomas on March 6 and 13th. There were no models brought for show and tell.

February 5, 2010, 20 in attendance

Treasurers report read and accepted. The business meeting was quickly dispensed. For show and tell, Gordon Dona brought 2 catapult gliders with hinged fuselages for DT and brought the workings for making simple viscous timers. He said \$10 would probably make 100 timers equivalent to what one can be purchased for. Dave Edmonson brought two 1/2 A Goldberg models, a Blazer and a Viking. The meeting was quickly adjourned to begin the auction.

1. Large Rubber: Any rubber model including SAM oldtimers.
2. Gas: Any size gas powered model. 7 sec engine for AMA and Classic, 9 for Nos, 5 for any FAI model.
3. Small Gas: Any model powered by 061 or less, 7 sec engine for AMA and Classic, 9 for Nos.
4. Large Gas: Any model larger than Small Gas 7 sec engine for AMA and Classic, 9 for NOS, 5 sec for any FAI model
5. Towline Glider: Any A-1, A-2, F1H, F1A, or Classic Towline (50 meter towline length)
6. SAM power event: Any Oldtimer model powered by SAM legal engine. Engine run to be determined
