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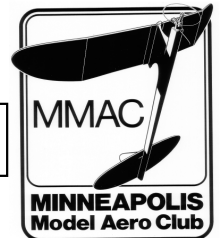
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“ Summer Contest Sunday, June 26, 2011!”

Per Dave Edmonson: May 6, 2011, 12 members present
Dave E. to check on a possible Inver Grove indoor site. Picnic contest, June 5, John Watkins to provide sign up sheet at the June 3 meeting for pot luck items to bring. John supplying brats. Don Monson CDing the Picnic Contest and will bring a large jar of pickles. Note to be published in the newsletter about changing the 75 year tradition of meeting at 8PM on the first Friday of the month.

John Watkins showed his new design of radio DT incorporated on a 1/2 A J Bird, built from a BMJR kit. For \$40 he had transmitter, receiver, and servo. Further refinements included an electronic DT, and backup fuse just to make sure (he lost a 1/2 A model last year, and almost ended up to his eyeballs in muck after trying to leap a drainage ditch. Good incentive for new DT systems!) The RC DT only weighed 7 grams including battery. Parts were purchased from Hobby King.com
Dave Edmonson showed recent HLG/CLG glider production along with a B Nos Gas Calypso Major to replace the one lost in 1958 and a Baby Sailplane powered by an Argo diesel. Bob Woodhouse exceeded

all other bidders on the ignition engines, and purchased the Forster 29, and Bantam 19.

Since 1937 the meetings have been held on the first Friday of the month. However, the club members being open minded, the issue will be discussed at the August meeting.

These were not NOS legal, and not really competitive for current gas events, and no bids were received. So they will be placed on the MECCA list. The Picnic Contest was discussed and a pot luck sign up sheet was sent around. Gary Oakins had some concerns about Dave Edmonson listing multiple events on our sanctions. Combined events, please specify "EXACT" NFFS event for points on score sheet.

1. Large Rubber: Any rubber model including SAM oldtimers.
2. Gas: Any size gas powered model. 7 sec engine for AMA and Classic, 9 for Nos, 5 for any FAI model..
3. Small Gas: Any model powered by 061 or less, 7 sec engine run for AMA and Classic, 9 for Nos.
4. Large Gas: Any model larger than Small Gas 7 sec engine for AMA and Classic, 9 for NOS,
5 sec for any FAI model
5. Towline Glider: Any A-1, A-2, F1H, F1A, or Classic Towline (50 meter towline length)
6. SAM power event: Any Oldtimer model powered by SAM legal engine. Engine run to be determined
