




PONDERINGS DEP'T

2011 RMC CONTEST REPORT ...SORT OF...Rick

The RMC's this year were pretty special in that the "theme" if you will, dedicated these champs to non other than Mr. Bill Gieskieng. Bill brings to our club a huge noteworthiness to the FF community. Many of the things we take for granted now were developed by Bill and adopted by the FF community.

In Bill's mind...at least the way he told it to me..."People give me too much credit for things I didn't do." That is Bill, sort of underspoken.

Just to show him it really was dedicated to him the club "comped" his entry fee and dinner. All part of being famous, so the next time you want to be famous...see if we dedicate an RMC to you!

Each contest report that comes thru can be a daunting task to write. This year is no exception. The CD's did a marvelous job in putting the whole thing together and the "new" out of town contestants could only do a 360 and stand in awe.

The weather couldn't have been more accommodating. Sure there were those breezy moments, but if you can't fly in the conditions, you have to ask yourself...is a mile chase on our field better than a mile chase into corn, beans or trees?

There was a point where the aerobatics of free flight took over. There was this turbulent boundary layer up about 25'. If your model didn't punch through it and you were caught in that shear between the top of it and the higher air, you model could get tossed all around. I saw, Eddie Van, Jack Murphy, Ken Cramsey, and I think it was Mike Pykelny that all fell victim to it. Fortunately, it didn't last long.

Our field can be pretty intimidating if you have never flown on it. Fortunately, it didn't slow anyone down...well...err...but that is another story. If anything, many of the flyers tried to bite off more than others.

That flying iron man, Bobby Hanford did his usual...enter every gas event there is and just keep flying. Challenging him was George Avila on the gas stuff. The two of them matched side by side.

Then there is Don, who CD'd and flew about 80 events. Rather than just enter all the gas events, I think he just enters all events and does what he can. Don and Herb Kothe had a great flyoff in WW1 Combat. Herb was up really high in a thermal and then started slowly descending, while Don's model didn't get but 20 off the ground. At about a minute or so, Don's model started going up and Herbs started going down...they passed on the way and Don's then went up high and Herb's landed! Go figure! Incredible.

That's the way it was folks. You should been there.

And...Neil Myers bested the whole pack in Tip Launch...a Magnificent MM performance against some of the best in the country. Only 33 seconds separated the top 5 flyers.


