Monthly meeting - 9/17/2013 by Dana Field

Attending the meeting were: Jack Vetter, Dana Field, Lynn Chaffee, Mike Basta, Tem Johnson, Ralph Preston, Jeff Renz, Wallie Freeburg, Emil Schutzel, Abe Gallas, Charlie Taylor, Scott Baird– This meeting was held at the JC Corinth Branch Library in Prairie Village.

Meeting was called to order at 7:05 pm.

Treasurer's Report – Lynn reported we had a balance of \$794.75. The report was accepted as presented.

Secretary's Report – Minutes from the June meeting were read, the meeting was actually cancelled because only the officers attended. The report was accepted.

Old Business

- 1) Flying Sites – Ralph Preston visited the oft discussed Myers Turf Farm at 191st and Metcalf to Pflumm. The manager/person wanted proof of insurance and stated that no vehicles could drive on the turf. Ralph left his phone number, but the owner has not called him back to date. Mike Basta has verbal permission from the owner of a site in Olathe at 162nd and Lone Elm Rd. Lone Elm is a north-south rd. just past Olathe Health Center at I-35 and 151st. The site will be good for east west winds, but short for north south wind. Mike Stated he would contact the AMA Site person for help in positively nailing down one or both of these sites.
- 2) Brochures – These had been put on hold until we had a flying site to list, but Mike was offered a deal on 100 brochures of \$50.83, and since we are out, he went ahead on 100 updated brochures.

New Business

- 1) Everything seems set for the Marion contest October 5 and 6. Bob Hanford had emailed about re-arranging the power schedule to even out the number of events flown on both days. More are to be flown on Saturday than Sunday, but Mike pointed out that the schedule was published and there are two more hours of flying time on Saturday than Sunday. It is a point for future discussion.

The business meeting was adjourned at 7:50 pm. The next meeting is Tuesday, October 15, and the meeting room at the Corinth Branch Library has been reserved for this meeting.

Show & Tell/Program – Ralph Preston gave a program on ignition engines. He brought a Hornet 60 and a Rocket (size?) to show. Most are 3 volt systems, and run on “white gas” (today's no-lead work?) cut 4/1 with 70 weight oil. Woody Bartell was discussed as a source (Ralph had catalogs), and mentioned high cost but great quality. We were out by 8:20.

And We Have A Champion! by Dana Field

Tuesday, September 10, the finals of the HAFFA 2013 Outdoor Championship took place at the field at Frontier Trails JH. And heated they were! All seven of the season long fliers, Mike Basta, Dana Field, Jeff Renz, Scott Baird, Lynn Chaffee, Jack Vetter, and Ralph Carlson were there, flying, and Wallie Berg was there as usual to watch and help out running a stop watch. Entering the final night Jeff Renz held a two point lead over Mike Basta, and after some strange turns of events, it was not decided who would be the new champion until the final flights. Mike Basta crushed his ½ Wake in June, and has only had a CLG and HLG to compete with since then. Jeff Renz has been competitive in both of those events, coupled with being nearly untouchable in the ½ Wake event. Strange things happen!

Jeff Renz had work business meetings run late, and showed up at the field as the sun was on it's way down and maybe 35 – 40 minutes total of flying time left. He proceeded to take out his HLG (Sweepette?) and hurriedly throw it into a big figure nine for a seven second flight, and a bunch of pieces that maybe can be repaired, or used as kindling, for a last place finish in that event. Any other toss this year would have gotten him a second place and a bunch more points. Mike Basta on the other hand tossed his Sweepette for a 38 second flight, good enough for first under the conditions, and went on to CLG. Jeff then flew his ½ Wake once for an untouchable 52 seconds and a first place, and went on to CLG as well. In the meantime, Dana Field put up a 53+second CLG flight, which overflowed the field for the first time, and spent the rest of the flying time trying to retrim his oft broken Obarski in HLG (Marion is around the corner). The last flight - after nothing higher than the low 40's all night, Mike Basta put up a 56 second CLG flight, as it was getting almost too dark to see, to beat Dana for the first time in two years. Jeff Renz was safely in third place in CLG for the night. The points – when the dust had settled, Mike Basta had nosed out Jeff Renz, by one point, to repeat as HAFFA Outdoor Champion for 2013. Congratulations to Mike Basta, HAFFA Champion!!
