Additional indoor flying dates will be announced as soon as they are finalized. Osawatomie will not allow us to schedule 2014 dates until near the end of the year.

Annual HAFFA Indoor Championship: 2014

We will again use A-6 planes to determine the Club Indoor Champion but the scoring method will change this year. The Championship will be determined at the <u>Annual Indoor Contest</u> (date to be determined). The Champion will be the individual with the highest total of points earned in the A6 mass launch event & the A6 timed event. Points will be given as follows: One point for entering and one point for each person you beat in each event.

Should there be ties, remember, one point for each person you beat. If you tie, you have not beaten the person you tie. For example, five people enter a mass launch. The first plane lands: one point. The second plane lands: two points. The third & fourth planes land at the same time: each gets three points. The fifth & last plane lands: five points. The same logic applies to the timed event.

If at the end of the <u>Annual Indoor Contest</u> there is a tie, the contestant with the highest score in the timed event will be the Champion.


