Mini-Model(Mud) Meet, September 15, 2013, Dave Edmonson CD

The meet started out with N winds, 5-10 mph, and by 12AM increased to 10-15 mph.. The max was set at 120 seconds. Seven people attended, and 5 flew officially. Prior to the contest, heavy rains fell making the roads a mud bath. The grass had soaked up all of the rain, and areas where there were no sod, were puddles because the ground was too dry to soak up the moisture. The sky remained overcast the entire day, but only a little mist fell at times and didn't cause any problems. Most flights stayed on the two fields in the direction of the drift which were sod and that made chasing easy. As the wind picked up later, longer flights went over the drainage ditch into crops. The day was actually pretty nice for flying, and those that did not show missed a good day playing with toy airplanes, and having to get a car wash!

Dave Braun taught Gary Oakins how to navigate drainage ditches, and Gary was complaining later about the smell of his pants. I later had a chance to navigate the drainage ditch, but opted to drive around, and stay out of them. I think everyone needed a car wash after the contest, and I got one on the way home. Of note was the return of Dave Braun's HLG that had been lost 2 or 3 years earlier by Tim Mattson from the local RC Sailplane club, MRCSS, who found it at a garage sale and tracked Dave down.

The HoSoFo event was hotly competed for with Tom Gustafson just missing his final max when his model hit the sprinkler system. He has more repairs to make. Gary Fessler provided generous prizes for the event.

Top left picture: Dave Braun on the left, and Tim Mattson from the MRCSS sailplane club. The glider had been lost for 2-3 years, and was found alongside a road about 10 miles away. Dave is holding both of his lost gliders. Bottom picture: Dave Edmonson's Hustler "OS", 240 square inches, with a Cyclon 049. Has been flying very consistent. Really burns up the air under power. This is a cleaned up design modification of Sid Jepson's 1958 1/2A Hustler. Thinner airfoils, D-box wing with carbon tube wing mounts, Ultracote Lite covering, Texas timer with DT function, weighs about 9 ounces. Took 2nd at the NATS in F1J event.
