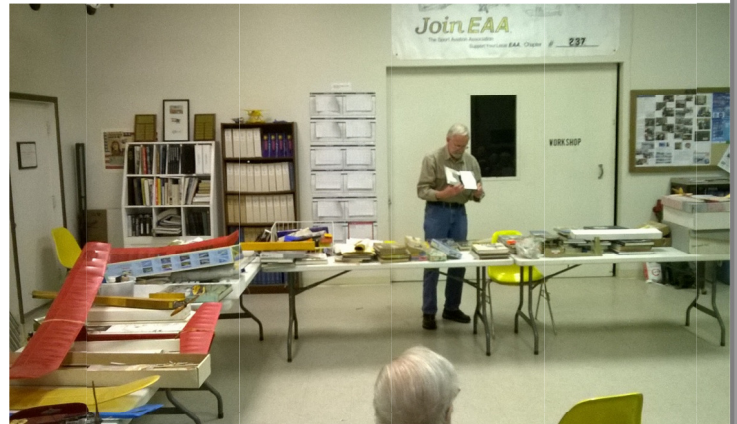

## The Prez Sez: *"Shop Talk and Handy Hints Redux"*

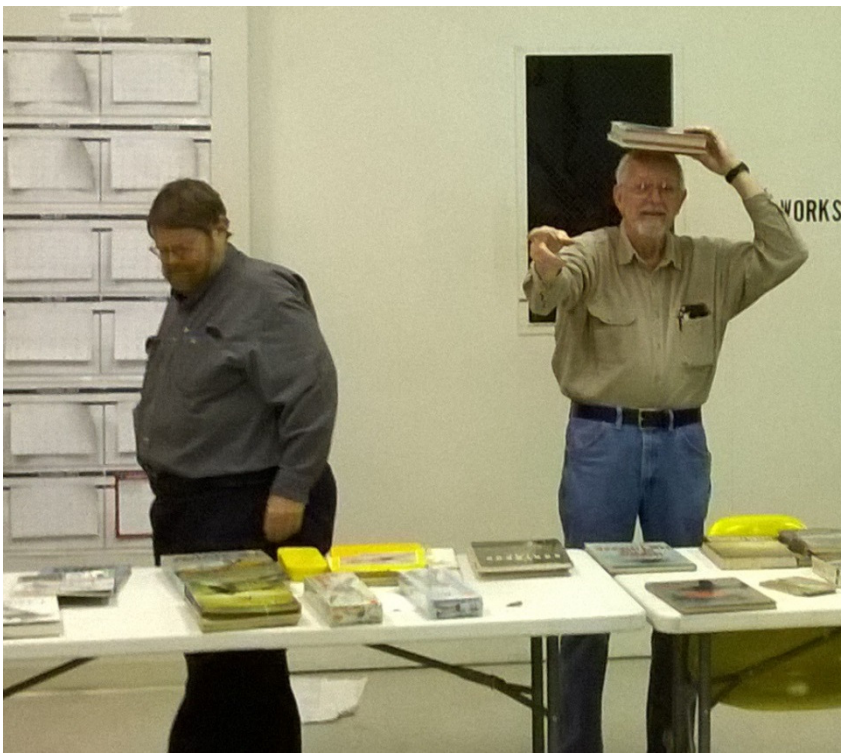
Terry Taylor mentioned that he finds emery boards to be handy for sanding those fidgety little parts that need a gentle touch. I believe they're available in a variety of grits and are probably inexpensive as well. I might have to raid the wife's feminine personal care cabinet to see what I can find there, On second thought, maybe not. A strip of sandpaper stuck to a popsicle stick or tongue depressor with a bit of spray cement and then trimmed, works well also. (Note to B. W. Grit Side Out)

As a home owner I spend a fair amount of time and money at Menards. They have a small craft section of plywood, balsa, and basswood and I generally stop by to check the quality on hand. It's Midwest balsa and I can usually find some very nice stuff. I don't tend to shop around much so I can't speak for the price, but it's always worth a look. I also find the 1/16 sq basswood to be very useful in spots that call for hard stringy balsa sticks; embryo front ends, etc. The strength gain is significant with a negligible weight penalty.

After a long absence from the contest scene, retirement found me back in action and in need of supplies. First order of business was a bottle of cyanoacrylate, so a trip to a local hobby shop was in order. I was shocked when the guy at the counter told me how much it cost. So shocked, in fact, that TWO moths flew out of my wallet. Anyway, I bit the bullet and bought the glue. Long story short, Gary Oakins told me about Loctite cyano at Menards and a good tip it was. They (Loctite) offer several types of dispensers but the best deal appears to be the 10 gram bottle for about three bucks. Good stuff and the shelf life has been good.

I guess that's plenty for now. Finished the Farman "Moustique" walnut the other day, next stop, the 1/2-A Satellite 226. (Look out Gary!!)
