Some more options for sticky stuff: Similar to Titebond, but sets in 5 minutes. Don't use for sheeting stuff, because it sets too fast. Does not sand well, might be good for stick fuselages. Try it on some samples before doing any serious projects: Available from Amazon.



From Dave Braun: More newsletter stuff, if you want/need it. Maybe you guys are way ahead of me on this, but I recently "discovered" a new adhesive that I've found to be useful. It's Elmer's "school glue" and the major benefit is that it goes on purple and dries clear. I've used it so far to adhere tissue to balsa, (thinned 50/50 it still has a purplish hue so you can easily confirm coverage) and to attach light cellophane windows to a peanut scale model. Probably not too good for general construction, but it has its uses. Not only that, now the paste-eating preschoolers will think they're swilling grape juice instead of milk. Not to worry; it's washable, safe and non-toxic! With the cold weather settling in I hope everyone is busy at the building board and is planning to attend the next indoor meet, or getting a jump on outdoor stuff for the coming summer season.

Sunday, November 19, 2017: Indoor Session CD: Dave Edmonson

Christ the King Church, New Brighton, close to Silver Lake Road and Hwy 694

5 in attendance, but we made up by flying a whole bunch of models and many flights from 5 to 9 PM!

The new gymnasium has 18 ft 3 inch ceilings to the lower beams with enough distance between beams to tight circle to 22 feet. The ceiling is almost obstacle free, and little chance for hang-ups.

Jim Jorgensen, Dave Braun, Dave Edmonson, flew most of the events, with Matt Decker flying several. Ron Cota tried valiantly to get his butterfly model going with several repair efforts.

Dave Braun's excellent flying No-Cal did flights 71 to 84 seconds. The butterfly always flies well in the low ceilings, with high time of 87 seconds. It was fun to see boxes of models and gear brought out to fly several events over the hours available, and the amount of effort to fly each event needs hours of preparation!

4 of us flew officially in 21 events with a total of 79 flights, average of 5 events and 20 flights each, lots of fun!
