




A great contest with 4 PMAC members there. Dick Nelson, who won the Dawn Gas Event. Dick Woods, Peter Brocks, and myself were also there.

I left early Sunday right after I put up my three flights in Jimmie Allen as I had to be back in Albuquerque on Monday morning so I don't have all the results but in FAI Lee Hines won the F1A event (6 entered), Vanlandingham won the F1B (7 entries), and Etherington won F1C (3 entries).

A pleasant surprise was the turnout in FAC. They have always had a couple of scale events but this year they expanded it to include 3 mass launch events, Jimmie Allen, and Golden Age Scale in addition to Peanut scale and FAC scale. The Mass Launch events are not judged but there were 28 entries to be judged in Peanut, FAC Scale, and Golden Age. There were quite a few in the 3 mass launch events too.

I didn't get results but there were 15 P-30s , 12 in Classic Towline, and 11 in $\frac{1}{2}$ A gas. A great turnout.

No field is perfect but if you weigh the plusses and minuses, this is a great one. I would also give high marks to the contest management.


