

#### PREZ SPEAKS

At our December meeting we completed two items of interest: we elected a slate of officers for 2012 and reviewed our financial situation and set dues for 2012. I know most of you will be disappointed, but after a heated campaign your current slate of officers got railroaded into another year of service. With exception of the President you actually have a solid group who are devoted to doing a great job for another year. Suggest you start now and take positive steps to throw your President out of office next time around!

Club dues for 2012 were increased \$5 to a total of \$25. Those who did not pay at the December meeting will get a dues notice very soon. Do your Treasurer a big favor and drop a check in the mail immediately. When you delay, your old Treasurer makes several needless trips to the bank.

PMAC and the TFFC are the benefactors of the Southwest Regional Modelers Association (SWRMA) as it relates to our flying field. In addition to paying for the site insurance for the field each year, SWRMA looks after and pays for the upkeep of the field. Recently, SWRMA spent approximately \$950 to rebuild some of the earthen bridges which were damaged by recent rains and to build and install two wooden bridges along the south boundary canal of the west field (RC field). We are fortunate for the deep pockets of SWRMA. Many years ago, Toby Blizzard did a fantastic job of raising the money that has kept us in business. Next time you see him . tell him THANKS!

The land that surrounds our flying field has been owned for many years by the same entity. Recently they elected to plant crops on some of it. We have permission to retrieve models that drift onto their land, but we must respect their crops. You can ride your chase bike on the land that is fallow. Do not under any circumstance ride into a planted area. If necessary, walk carefully in the planted area and avoid walking on the plants. Moving the flight line to stay away from planted areas will become a common necessity. Dond bitch at the CD, just comply!

The field set up for the upcoming SWR will be different than in past years. The FAI flight line will be located on the west field with the AMA/NOS/ SAM Free Flight flight line located approximately where the FAI line has been in previous years. The SAM RC activity will be located on an extension of the AMA line but located much closer to Toltec Road. These changes are driven by farming activity to the east and south of our current field. More on this later.

Ites time to start planning for our indoor contest in March. Steve Riley is the CD. He has been working with the Superintendent of Schools for the Round Valley School District (owners) located in Eagar, AZ. This is a geodesic dome that is nominally 100 feet high and clear of any supporting structure. At our January meeting love asked Bob Loeffler and Al Lidberg to give us some ideas on what types of models we beginners+ might build for this event. 


#### The New Scoring System

As most of you know, Bruce Grawburg has been working on a new scoring system for our monthly contests. He has done a heck of a job that will make the life of the score keeper much easier. Here is a quick overview.

The revised program is actually very similar to our current program with one addition. We will continue to fly in the six categories that you are familiar with. By our definition, the models we fly fall into one of three basic disciplines: rubber powered, gliders of all types, and gas/electric engine/motor driven. Bonus points can now be earned by flying in more than one discipline. The reason for the addition of the discipline bonus points reflects the view of several of our members that the overall club champion should demonstrate expertise in more than just one of the three disciplines. We chose to use an incentive system rather than making it mandatory that the club champ had to fly in at least two or all three disciplines. Bruce developed the program so we can run simulations against our 2011 data base. We can assign any value to our current variables and test the effect of the change. The current variables were 5 points for each max, 10 points if three official flights were flown and 2 points for each competitor within a given category you beat. We can now assign any value for these as well as any value to the discipline bonus points and test the effect. The program is close to being in concrete, but we are still running simulations to find the optimum balance. The program will be used starting with our February contest.




