Proz Speaks

With two contests under our belt using the new scoring system, a couple of things have developed much along the line we were expecting. What we were hoping for, was a broadening of the types of models most contestants would be flying. Remember, for each different discipline a contestant flies after the first model he flies, he will earn 4 additional "bonus" points. Neither the February nor the March contests had great flying conditions because of the wind. Yet, those who are interested in rising to the top of the ladder board quickly learned it pays to diversify the events you fly. In the February contest Jean Andrews came out on top because of his diversification. At the same time, Dick Nelson dropped in the pack because he stayed with his strong suite which is Nos Gas. In the March contest, Dick diversified fully and quickly regained his customary top slot. My assumption is in short order we will began to see some real competition develop in such as events as Cat Glider, P-30 or 1/2A Gas as people scramble to pick up some easy diversification bonus points. I think this will be a fun season because of this.

The March contest was difficult because the forecast wind was expected to hit as much as 20 mph by mid to late morning. As such folks made a few improper moves to take advantage of the limited time to fly. Remember, it is safety first, sorties next! In the rush to fly there were some models launched upwind of the parked cars. We all know the rule. Launch downwind of the cars and spectators by at least 100 feet. A few months ago, our two clubs reviewed the separation distance between the parking line and the flight line. At that time, we agreed the two lines would be separated by at least 150 feet! It's the CD's responsibility to pace this off to 150 feet. It is then all of our responsibility to live with this stipulation. So let's do it!

Timing also needs a bit of tightening up. Please assure your timer understands the motor run limits. While no one was playing cop, it was apparent to more than one casual observer that not everyone was readjusting their motor runs to the Cat III limits. The "CD had announced we would fly to "Cat III" limits as the contest opened. Another area that apparently was either misunderstood was the proper procedure the timer must follow if the model is lost from the timer's view. The rule is count to 10; if the model comes back into view continue the watch. If the model fails to come back into view — stop the watch and subtract ten seconds. Finally, the person chasing the model cannot signal to the timer when the model lands. The timer must see the model hit the ground or must follow the procedure for "lost from view" discussed above.

The indoor contest in Eagar, AZ was a big success. The report elsewhere in this news letter reflects good participation and the fact the facility is a super place to fly indoor models. The event attracted a past world champ and several very proficient fliers from around the country. Think light weight models. Some of them weighed less than half a gram. This was my first go at building and flying indoor models. While the good models reached the 104 foot ceiling and flew for as much as 20 minutes, my "heavy weights" barely got above my head and flew for seconds rather than minutes! It's a real challenge! What a fun learning curve! A great big thanks goes to Steve Riley. Super contest Steve!

Once he saw just what we were going to fly there and that we were willing to work with his students on an aviation project (Delta Darts to begin with) he became quite receptive.




