DEC/08 MEETING MINUTES - J.MERRILL

12/12/08

Twelve in attendance tonight on 12/12, including: Mike Pykelny, Bob Beecroft, Harry Steinmetz, Don Bartick, Don Riordan, Howard Haupt, Larry Miller, Larry Bagalini, John Hutchison, John Oldenkamp, John Alling, and John Merrill.

After our customary consumption of our favorite pizza (thanks again, Howard!), President Mike Pykelny called the meeting to order at 7:15p.m. Minutes of the last meeting were approved as published.

Treasurer's Report - \$1,835.00 as published in last month's E.T. See "Money Maters" column for latest update.

A round of applause went to Howard Haupt for his two major contributions to the newsletter this year: the "Money Maters" column, and for putting the newsletter out via e-mail. Using e-mail will save the club a considerable amount of money every month.

Contest Report – November's monthly was cancelled due to inclement weather, and it was decided December's monthly isn't looking good either, as more weather is due to move in. It was decided to postpone until December 21st.

The next big contest is in Eloy, Arizona, on January 17th and 18th 2009. It is the same date of our monthly contest, so it was decided to move ours to January 11th, and the featured event will be P-30. Don Bartick talked about the Eloy contest. He reports it is pretty easy to get to, just take Interstate

8 until it meets I-10, and its about 3 miles past that intersection. He went on to report that it is normally cold until about 10:00a.m., then it warms up to be okay. Don also reported that it is always a relaxed, friendly, fun contest, and well attended. You can camp on the field if you wish. The contest is the Southwest Regionals, and they have a web-site for more information.

Don then reported that the Fresno club will join us for the Dual-Clubs Annual, now moved to May 16th and 17th 2009.

We then “nailed down” next year’s competition schedule, which should be published shortly.

New Business – it was previously reported that our Scripps Ranch meeting site may be closing, which was to be voted on by city council in November. We learned that they did include the site, among others, in the list of those to be closed. It may close as early as January, but we don’t have their schedule yet, so it was decided we should all start looking into another site ASAP. John Merrill was volunteered to look into the possibility of using the San Diego Air and Space Museum downtown, as many clubs use the museum for meetings. If any of our readers know of a site, please let us know!

Old Business – Our banquet is to be held at Giovanni’s on January 10th in Kearny Mesa. John Hutchison reported that Scale Staffel has decided to host 3 contests again next year, as it did in 2008. The dates of the contests will be March 15th (which may have to move to March 22nd), June 28th, and October 25th. Get those scale planes ready!

John also reported that Scale Staffel is having its annual Christmas party and fun-fly contest on December 19th at the San Carlos Rec. Center, starting at 6:45p.m. Pizza will be provided, as well as the airplanes for the contest. The planes are a one-design, all being built and donated by Gerald Sullivan.

John then reported that he has done demonstrations for 130 kids to get them excited about the Regional Science Decathlon at Cuyamaca College on March 7th ’09.

Don Bartick made mention of a good article in the latest edition of the NFFS Digest. The article addresses a battery load tester, made by GB Instruments, model GBT500A. It is said to run for about \$13.00 at Ace Hardware, and Radio Shack

may have them as well. The tester will be very handy for testing the batteries in your Walston retrieval system.

Show and Tell – John Oldenkamp showed us two very nice airplanes. The first was an E-Pearl, scaled up from a 1970’s design. It will now qualify for electric AMA “B” class. John also showed us and F1E magnet-steering glider with an 80” wing span. He reports that there are several suitable hills at our Otay site on which to launch the plane. Both the planes were white with red trim, and both very attractive. John then showed us a two-piece fuselage boom for another F1E glider, made with carbon fiber on the inside, and Kevlar on the outside, and very light and strong. They are from the Czech Republic, and made from a world champ in the class.

The meeting was adjourned at around 8:40ish. No indoor flying ensued this evening.

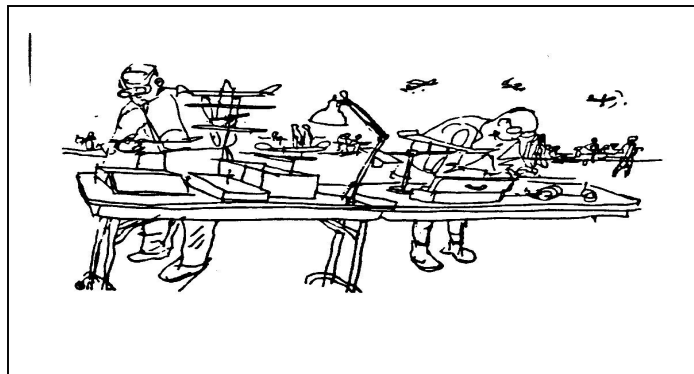

Subject: Dues Renewal

It is once again time to renew our membership to the LHFMAA. After consideration by the Board the basic dues for 2009 will remain at \$20/year, however, to renew for \$20 you must send your renewal form and check in by January 15, 2009. Because quite a few flyers did not register by mail prior to last year's Isaacson's Winter Classic, the first contest of the year, there was a sizable bottleneck at the sign-in table cause by on-field renewals which placed an undue burden on the CD running the contest.

On-field renewals throughout the year and the subsequent continual need to update AMA records is another really time consuming job. Therefore, in order to encourage early membership renewal, all renewals made after Jan. 15, 2009 and all renewals made on the field will be \$25.

The two year discount renewal is still \$35, except, as noted, if it is made after Jan. 15, 2008 or made on the field ; then it will revert to \$40/2-years (\$25 + \$15).

There is also a yearly family discount rate for two adults living in the same house for \$35. The family discount for two years is \$65 (\$35 + \$30). The family discount after Jan. 15th or made on the field for two years is \$80 (\$50 + \$30).

There is no penalty for first time members.

Note: Quite a few members paid for two years last year so don't send dues if you have already paid for 2009.

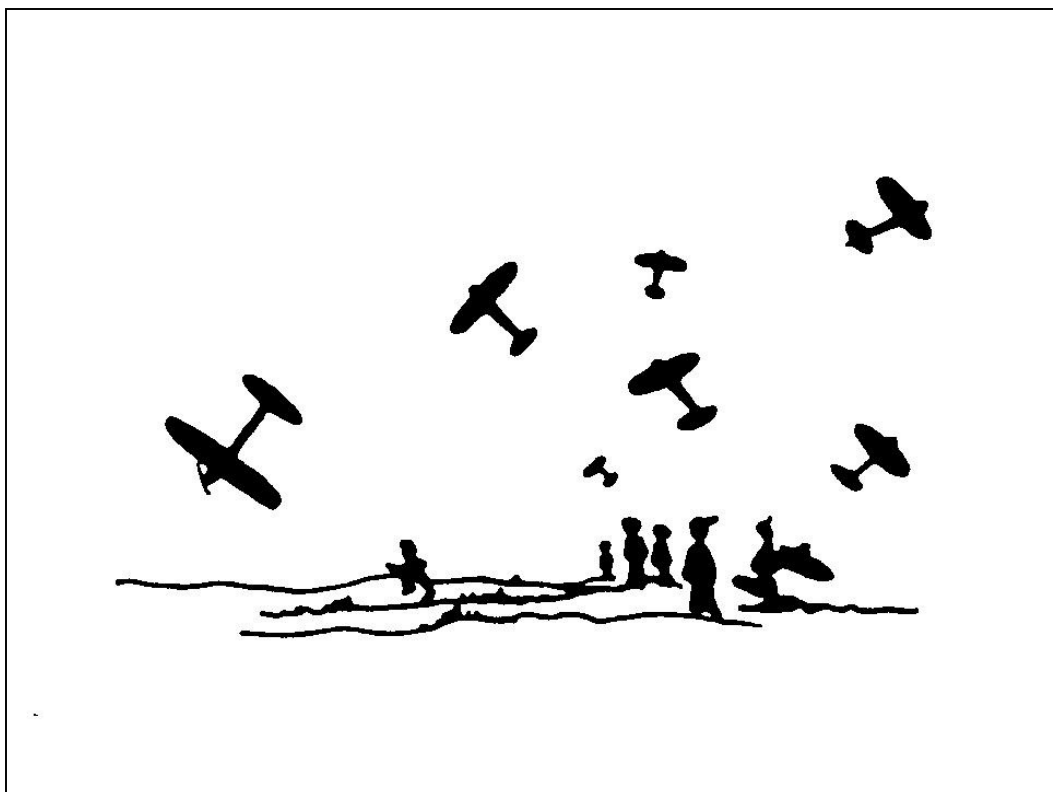

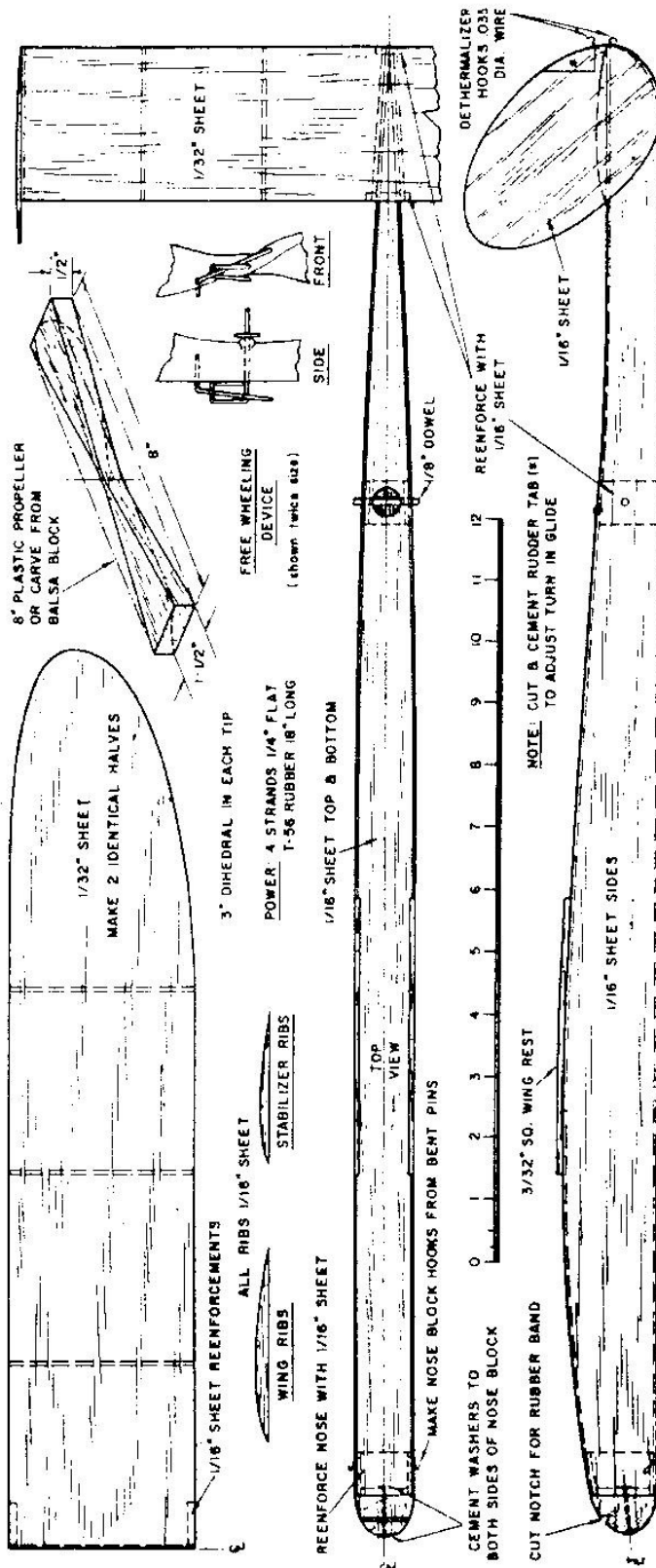

The **Contestor**, a 29 inch span all sheet model appeared in the Febuary 1959 issue of American Modeler. Built from carefully chosen medium-soft balsa , its performance is such that a dethermalizer would be an advidable addition. One wonders if it was known to the intial P-30 organizers. I'm going to slide another inch into the wing span on mine and try a 9.5 inch prop.....

Sounds like the '08 Indoor World Champs was a Serbian Sweatfest! Wow! 100+ degree heat in the Belgrade facility – with the models being blown back 'n forth with the currents, 'way up high!! But it looks like the USA Team wound up in 1st, with John Kagan, Jim Richmond and Doug Schaefer doing the 3, 4 & 5 thang!! Thanx, Guys..... A few others had barely higher individual times, but no country had higher composite (team) times!

As Jim tells it, this place (the exhibition hall) has the largest unsupported concrete dome in the world. As mentioned above, the USA Open team finished 1st, but our Junior team finished 6th, due to the fact that one of our team members had to drop out, because of illness. But our remaining 2 Juniors (Justin Young and Tim Chang) were 1 & 2 in high individual times! I thought it was neat that a lady (Gabriela Kaplanova of the Czech Republic) finished 3rd, behind the US guys! Her contribution helped win 1st place for the Czech Republic Junior team!

Sez Jim.... "With the 100+ degree heat, there were times when Marianna & I were both ready to pass out, and times when I really didn't care how things turned out. The jet stream at the top rapidly carried planes from the sunny side, across the concrete discs at the top. If you didn't get it with the balloon (no steering allowed under the disc!), the plane would then be carried on along the bottom of the girders, and down the side!"

"We found out later how Schramm & Treger were able to deal with the above problems (helps to have prior site knowledge!) They flew a few feet under the "jet stream" where the air was more peaceful – and steering easier to manage.

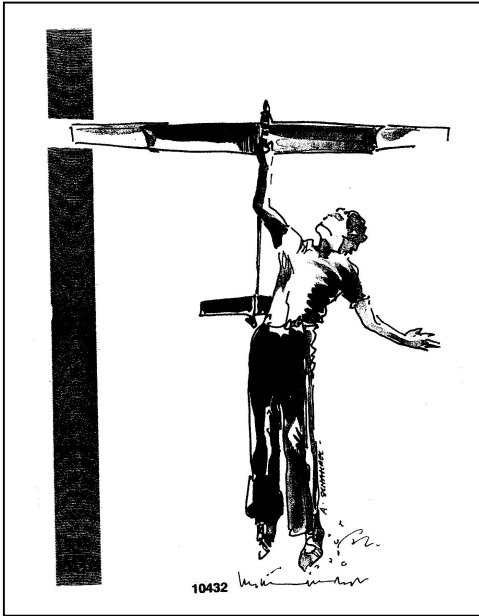
