
## ON THE LIGHTER SIDE - H.Haupt

## A MATTER OF MONEY - H.Haupt

My last email from the Scripps Ranch Civic (SRCA) Association reads as follows. Note the question asked at the end of the email that needs a n answer from the club.

"Howard: I'll schedule you for continued 2 ND Friday from 7-10pm. Please advise on how many folks you typically have in attendance?

As to fees, SRCA is going to eat the loss for a lea st the next 90-120 days while we work out a breakeven budget based on cost of utilities, liability insurance, supplies, janitorial, pest control, building maintenance, etc... After that, I would expect that there will likely be some charge, albeit minimal for once/month users. The monthly HOA users and some of the non-profits are currently paying \$40-\$60 for their 2-3 hour meetings, and some of non-profits have been paying nothing. We need to talk to some of the non-profits that might have a revenue source and could possibly subsidize the others, and price HOA alternatives that may allow us to slightly increase their cost to help subsidize groups such a syourself.

What would you think would be a fair and reasonable charge for a group such as yours to use the facility for 3 hours on a Friday eve? \*\*GB\*\*"



Meeting was adjourned at 8:00.




