

June 2009 MEETING MINUTES – J.Merrill

12 in attendance tonight, including one guest. Don Bartick, with his son Brian, Jerry Sullivan, Howard Haupt, Gus Del Castillo, Harry Steinmetz, Larry Bagalini, Bob Overcash, President Mike Pykelny, John Oldenkamp, John Hutchison, and John Merrill.

The meeting was called to order at 7:15p.m.

The minutes of the last meeting were approved as published.

Treasurer's Report – It was noted it may be helpful to note a (+) or a (-) in the monthly "Money Maters" report.

Old and New Business (It was quite the jumble, you can try to figure out which is which). President Mike P. brought up the subject of "The Book", as was discussed last month. The book is to be used by the Contest Coordinator, and all C.D.s as a reference guide. It contains our charter, by-laws, points system, etc. John H. said that all C.D.s should have a copy of their own. John O. said he will make up some score sheets. Harry S. reminded us that new members should also receive a copy so they will know the club's rules. Don B. will type up the field safety rules, to be included in the book. All will be available for the June meeting. The thought was brought up by Bob O. to scan the rules and so-forth of the book into an attachment or link on our website.

The menu by Wanda was passed around. She is our new food provider for the Dual-Club Annual Contest.

Participation Awards and plaques for the Annual were shown.

Don B. reported that raffle prizes/money for the Champs in September is being sought. He would like to see the Orbiteers contribute \$100.00 toward the event. It was decided to table the idea until next month, to see how we do at the Annual. The U.S. Free Flight Champs is the biggest contest west of the Mississippi.

Don B. told us of someone from the Fresno club sending him a copy of a 1954 Air Trails Magazine. It listed Don as winning a 1/2A gas event as a junior

in an event report. Unfortunately there wasn't a picture included.

Larry B. reported that A & B Electric is now being considered for National Cup points. After much discussion, Harry S. then made a motion (John O. 2nd) that we report to AMA that we are flying F1Q's as AMA B class. The motion passed unanimously.

Show and Tell: Larry B. showed us a TINY altimeter, called "How High". The little electric units, which report altitude, are available for R.C. or F.F.

John O. had two planes for our perusal. The first was a Coupe, with a 220sq.in. wing, and a wood tapered tube boom. It was covered with Russian tissue, obtained from Larry B. The next plane was a 133% version of "Electro-Light", which was first published in 1975. It was the 1st published electric free flight plane. John covered this one with Mylar. It can be flown as sport electric, or in F1Q. It weighs only 4.08 oz. without motor or batteries. Both aircraft were very attractive.

The meeting was adjourned at approximately 8:20 p.m., and we actually flew indoor for the first time this year! There will likely be an indoor report elsewhere in this issue, but suffice it to say that Howard H. caught some great indoor thermals.

MONEY MATTERS A DISCUSSION -H.Haupt

As a club, we are registered as a non-profit organization. The numbers I have prepared, that on the previous page, certainly bear that out. Using the detail information I have tracked each month in 'Money Matters', for a fiscal year running from June/2008 thru May 2009, the club currently stands at loss of (\$177) for the fiscal year.

Projecting for the new fiscal year, you can see the numbers show a projected gain of \$185 for the club treasury. This based on known fixed income and expenses.

What does this tell us as we move forward? First, the income (i.e. Dues) we have coming in covers our known fixed expenses. Second, any variable expense the club would consider spending, would potentially lower the club balance, unless a funding source is identified to cover it.

Another area for consideration is the unknown expense we will be asked to pay for our meeting space at Scripp's. If and when it kicks in, will determine how much of our projected positive cash position, will be used in the future fiscal year.

Discussion? Options?

- Raise the dues?
- Deposit all 'Monthly' fees into treasury?
- Charge a higher dues rate to members who have a newsletter mailed to them?
- Identify and plan for revenue generating events?
- If a meeting space fee is charged at our Scripps' meeting location, how will the club pay for it?
- Stay the course, i.e. do nothing?

Have some input, ideas, or opinions? Come to the meeting on June 12^{TH} and lets hear them.




ON THE LIGHTER SIDE - H.Haupt
