


See the San Diego Orbiteers Club Bylaws published in this issue.

10/09/09

Only 7 in attendance tonight, including: V.P. Larry Miller, Don Bartick, Gus Del Castillo, Bob Overcash, Howard Haupt, John Hutchison, and John Merrill.

The meeting was officially called to order at 7:25p.m. by Larry Miller.

Minutes of the last meeting where approved as published. Yeah!

Treasurer's Report – We currently have \$1610.60 in the acct. See "Money Maters" elsewhere in this issue for a complete update.

No other officer's reports, other than Don Bartick reported that the Otay field porta-potty has now been serviced. Much rejoicing ensued.

Contest Reports – Don Bartick gave more details of the contest he reported on in the last newsletter. John Hutchison reported on the Westfac II event held Sept. 25-27 in Gainesville, Texas. John said that 100 planes were judged, and they had a total of 45 flyers. You can check the Westfac website for pics and more info. In 2011 it will be held in Colorado, then it moves back to Perris in 2013. John then reported that the Gymbox contest has been moved to the 1st Sunday in February to give folks more time to build one. If you still need plans, contact Bob Overcash.

Old Business – Don Bartick is getting the Art Way Memorial Flight ready for the November contest. New Business – Larry Miller reminded us that November is the nominations for officers, so come prepared. If you miss a meeting, you may get elected/railroaded into office!

Larry said we also need to nail down next year's contest schedule, and we will adjust the schedule from this year's calendar. He will bring a proposal to the November meeting.

Instead of moving to Show and Tell, we had the pre-arranged "Helpful Hints" night.

Bob Overcash started off with several interesting items. First, he had 2 Airscrew balsa strippers epoxied together, which works really well for up to ½". He then showed us a plastic prop which he had hollowed out to just the outline, and a small piece about ½ way in between. It was then covered with Japanese tissue on one side, then a coat of lacquer. This managed to remove about 2/3 of the weight of


the prop. He sent me a drawing of the details, and it has been included elsewhere.

Larry Miller then showed us some of his goodies, including a neat little tool made from 2 hacksaw blade sections that were glued together, about 4" long. There was a small piece of balsa glued on about 1/16" up from the teeth, to act as a depth gauge. The tool is used to notch a T.E. for inserting ribs. The depth can be adjusted to whatever you like. Larry got the idea from John Oldenkamp. Larry then showed us a very clever aluminum blast tube which had a notch cut lengthwise so as to allow a very quick and easy way of extraction after your motor is wound. The Crockett hook slides right down the length of the tube, so it never touches the rubber inside. He then showed us a jig with small triangular pieces that help hold other stock during sanding of planing. Last but not least, he had a spar with carbon fiber in the middle which adds a lot of strength, but little weight. Many other ideas were then cast around the table for a considerable time

Bob Overcash then awarded 2 pocket knives to the winners of the Helpful Hints night. First prize went to Don Bartick, and 2nd to Larry Miller.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:30 p.m.

Wile trying to think up a way to have a lighter prop without carving one out of wood I came up with this. With a plustic prop I hoged out these parts of a 5" prop with my dremel tool and a bit with burrs along the shall witch allows you to cut in all directions. The thicker the prop the better. Now simply glue tissue over each blade and dope. My prop came out two thirds lighter. I only covered the front of the blade but you could cover the back also.

2009 Southwest FAI Challenge - B.BOOTH

October 24 & 25, 2009 Boulder City, NV



Each of the last few years I have had the opportunity to sit here and describe another Southwest FAI Challenge that had extraordinary weather, great flying and superb flyoffs. This year the weather forecast told us we would have a little more wind than usual, in the 8-10 MPH range, but still very flyable, especially on the wide-open El Dorado dry lakebed. What we had on Saturday however, was another ...ho-hum.... perfect day. The thermal activity was typical for Boulder City with gentle lift and as Rich Rohrke commented, winds gusting to 2 MPH. For those of us accustomed to flying at Lost Hills and waiting for that "fill" after the calm, it was a little unnerving at times because there often just wasn't any fill.

It was terrific to see three F1C flyers in attendance including Mike Roberts who joined us to chase Americas Cup points. Ed Carroll and Henning Nyhgen pushed Mike to a clean score and a first place finish that secured the 2009 Americas Cup in F1C. Between F1A and F1B, there were 9 clean scorecards through 6 rounds, but Round 7 took its toll, knocking Don Zink out of F1A and Bob Piserchio, Roger Morrell and Dick Wood from the red number list in F1B. All but one of the remaining F1A & F1B flyers easily made the 5 minute flyoff round. Rich Rohrke had an unfortunate power flop that cost him precious altitude. As the air cooled and the sun began to set, we all prepared for the deciding 7 minute flights. For those that have not been to Boulder City, it is hard to describe just how perfect those last flights at the end of the day can be. Mike McKeever and Brian Van Nest towed together for a few minutes, with Mike launching 40 seconds or so ahead of Brian. For the next 4-5 minutes we watched as the models glided together in about the same area, with Brian touching down just before Mike, giving Mike the win. About ten minutes later, Blake and I were off floating in a very similar scenario, against the rugged hills and the orange sunset. My model landed several seconds before Blake and thought he had won handily. I did not realize he had launched almost 20 seconds after I did. The final result still found Blake on top of the heap, but only by 4 seconds! That flyoff may be the flight that secured the 2009 F1B Americas Cup for Blake as well (but I made him earn it!) F1Q continues to be a growing event at this meet. This year we had 5 entries. Returning Champion Bernie Crowe stumbled in Round 1, but the field came back to him over the next 6 rounds he pulled back out in front and repeated his win from 2008, followed by Mike Pykelny and Larry Bagalini. In F1P, perennial winner Tony Robertson hiccupped in Round 1 and Junior Team hopeful Taron Malkhasyan didn't let him off the hook, taking home the first place glassware. Taron's brother Sevak put in a good showing in F1B as well although he tested the CD's nerves by launching in the last 30 seconds of not one, but two rounds!

And then there was Sunday. The wind we didn't see on Saturday joined the forecasted wind for Sunday. We finally gave up hope at about 10AM when the "lulls" were 15 MPH and the gusts upward of 25 MPH. An announcement regarding a rescheduled date will be made soon. This most likely will be at Perris and will NOT count for Americas Cup points because of the change in venue. Rescheduling for Boulder City is just not practical. Look for a notice on SEN soon.

Many thanks to Bob Beecroft for working the table so that I could fly and to our long distance visitors, the Clapps, Mike Roberts, Blake Jensen and Henning Nyhgen. We were very pleased to see record seven Orbiteers in attendance. Of course we are always glad and grateful to see all the "regulars" and to Jon Zeisloft who kept this meet afloat all by himself for several years so that it was still around for us to carry on.

Put this contest on your calendar for next year. I realize it is not Lost Hills and Denny's, but we can offer a decent alternative with an unlimited choice of accommodations including the world famous Las Vegas Strip, 5-Diamond Resorts, superstar entertainment & shows, fine art galleries (ever seen a Rembrandt or Van Gogh?) and genuine world class dining, all within a 30 minute drive of a magnificent field.

The field is located between San Jacinto Avenue and I-215 on the northeast side of I-215 (opposite side of freeway from City of Perris)

Approximate GPS coordinates at field entrance: 33° 47' 10.80" N 117° 12' 06.81" N

From the North: Take the D Street exit off I-215. Proceed to Fourth Street/Hwy 74, turn left and cross back over the freeway.

From the South: Take the Fourth Street/Hwy 74 exit off I-215 and turn right.

Once headed north proceed 1 block to San Jacinto Avenue (Shell station) and turn right. Proceed east approximately 3/4 miles.

The dirt access road to the flying area is on the far side of the dirt storm drainage channel.





ARTICLE 2: AUDIT

The President or his appointees will make a periodic audit of the Treasurer's books.

ARTICLE 3: TERMS OF OFFICE

- All elected officers of the Club shall serve for a two (2) year term. Officers are to be elected by a
 vote of simple majority of those present at the regular meeting in the month of December of even
 numbered years. New officers will take office at the January meeting. Other personnel may be
 appointed by the elected officers and confirmed by a simple majority vote of those members
 present during a regular meeting: i.e. Newsletter Editor, Contest Director, etc.
- 2. Nomination of Club officers shall be made at the general membership meeting during the month of November of even numbered years. Nominations for office may be made by any active Club member holding voting rights, either in person or by submitting a proxy nomination to an existing officer. All known nominations for office will be published in the newsletter prior to the election.
- A secret ballot is required for elections, for removal of a Club officer, a member of the Executive Committee and for expulsion of a member from the Club unless waived by a simple majority vote of the members present at the meeting.

ARTICLE 4: VACANCIES

Vacancies in any office shall be filled by appointment by, the remaining officers, such appointee
to serve until the end of the term for which the predecessor was elected.

ARTICLE 5: COMMITTEE

 The committee of the Club shall be appointment by the President and may be standing or ad-hoc, with the approval by a simple majority vote of the members present at a meeting (if a vote is requested,, to serve throughout the term, or less, of his tenure of office. Standing Committees are the Safety Committee and the Field Maintenance Committee.
