Fudo Takagi (1921 - 2013) - H.Haupt

At the age of 92, Fudo has taken his last big thermal ride into the sky. Fudo hailed from Chicago, and was active with the Chicago Aeronauts, flying free flight models. Some of those early flying years included riding the street car to the end of the line, and flying in the grass covered fields with only a few farm houses in site.

As a young adult, Fudo worked in the Chicago area before coming to the San Diego. I suspect work in the aero space industry is what lured him to our area. His career as a machinist, served him well, while pursuing his hobby interests.

I first met Fudo at the Madison High School gym, where I was flying my first indoor plane, an EZB that was built after school with the guidance of Clarence Mather, as a school club activity. Fudo was flying EZB as well, for it was a new and up and coming indoor class, at the time.

From that first meeting, Fudo was always in my sphere of model airplane activity.

A review of the club history, via the El Torbellino, I find Fudo was a member of the club in 1966, when he was elected Treasurer. He held that post until a few years back, when the money minder duties were passed to me.

Fudo submitted the original El Torbellino mast head design which was actively used until 1974. This is the mast head that has been used for this issue. As a columnist, Fudo wrote a monthly column called 'In & Out', where non-mainstream free flight activities were talked about. His A-6 design was first published in September 1974, with models of that design still being flown today.

As a master machinist Fudo was well skilled in detail work, with this trait carrying over into all his pursuits. All his construction projects were done to perfection, be it Free Flight & Scale Models (indoor & outdoor), creating

mechanical gadgets such as (timers, winders, torque meters, scales) or trophies, you name it he could build it. Although the bulk of his photography work preceded me knowing him, I have been told his work in the field was well regarded with his pictures being published in all the model airplane magazines of the time.

A visit to Fudo's garage and work shop was an eye opening experience. The first impression was that of a space so packed with boxes, that only a narrow path leads the way to the work bench. It too was covered in a layer of tools, projects in process, and materials of model airplane building. It did not seem possible for Fudo to produce such well constructed Free Flight models in such a constrained space with no visible flat area to actually work. But, for Fudo, this work space was the genius of his productivity as a model builder. No need to understand how the space works, just look at the results in the air. I would be a miss to not mention the concise way Fudo employed the use of the English language. The classic example would be the verbal treasurer's reports at the monthly meetings. These reports would be recorded in the meeting minutes as: "We are OK", "The account is low", "It is normal", or "We not so good".

Roger Willis shared the following Fudo story: I was just learning to fly. Fudo was flying next to me at Otay Mesa when my new FAC Moth got into its first thermal. I was amazed and shouting "LOOK LOOK ... Fudo", without missing beat he looked at me and said.... "hay, in a thermal you can fly a 2 x 4". I will never forget that and have told it to all my new builders in building classes in Arizona.

So long my old friend, with the march of time we will catch up with you, on are own last big thermal in the sky,









Cezar Banks (1926 - 2013) - H.Haupt

The Orbiteers' resident indoor expert has left the hall. For those of you who flew indoor with Cezar, you are bound to have memories of his presence. Born and raised in Kenosha Wisconsin, Cezar spent the bulk of his working career working as an Electrical Engineer at General Dynamics Convair.

My first meeting with Cezar was at Otay Mesa, where he came to the field with Clarence Mather, and was introduced as a free flight modeler coming back into the fold after an absence of a number of years. His goal at the time was to get back into indoor free flight. This being 1978, Cezar became part of my indoor flying life from that point forward.

From the get go, Cezar had his sights set on indoor micro film planes, and competing in the F1D class. Along the way, he and Clarence became F1D confidants, with both gaining from each others experiences. I viewed Cezar's efforts as very successful, in qualifying for a number of F1D US Teams and competing on the world stage against the best the world has to offer. Winning the individual world title did elude him, but he did finish 2ND on the world stage a number of times.

Indoor Penny Plane flying was maturing when Cezar picked up the indoor bug, and shifting to a sub-class called Novice Penny Plane. Cezar put together a Novice PP design that was a world beater, and was build & flown successfully by hundreds of individuals over time. Another design for an indoor torque meter was quite elegant.

With the passage of time, I shared many trips with Cezar to various indoor venues. Our time together, looking back, seems to of passed much too quickly. I can still hear his booming voice providing trimming advice while flying indoor.

HAND LAUNCH GLIDER & CATAPULT GLIDER

Hand Launch Glider & Catapult Glider will to be launched from an established glider pen on the field. Max's are 120 seconds and all flights count.

E36/A/B ELECTRIC

E36: 36" Max. wing span, min. weight 120 gms, 2 cell Lithium Polymer battery pack max, fixed surfaces except DT. Folding props are allowed. Hand launch flights. 6 attempts to complete 3 official 120 sec flights with 15 sec motor runs, 40 sec minimum official flight. Fly off flights have motor run reduced to 10 sec first fly off, then reduced to 5 sec and continue at 5 sec until 120 sec flight time is not achieved.

AMA A: Any number of cells of any rechargeable battery technology, fixed surfaces except DT, 6 attempts to complete 3 official 120 sec flights with 10 sec motor runs, 40 sec minimum official flight. Fly off flights have motor run reduced to 5 sec and continued at 5 sec until 120 sec flight time is not achieved.

AMA B: Same as A except variable surfaces are allowed.

NIGHT GAS FLYING

All engine classes combined. Event window between 6pm – 9pm. Engine runs in accordance with aircraft classification; i.e., AMA or Nostalgia.

DAKOTA

Target time 60 seconds. Score based on differential of actual flight time to target time. Lowest score of 3 flights combined.

MINI FAI EVENTS Low stress format

F1G, F1H, F1J/P: <u>First five (5) flights must be flown from the established line between 7:00 – 12:00 AM. 120 sec max</u> Fly-off in ½ hour rounds starting at 1:00 PM. 15min rounds in sequence. 15min between end of round and beginning of next one. Fly-off round max: 1st 150sec, 2nd 180sec, 3rd 210sec, 4th 240sec, 5th 300sec, 6th 360sec and so on. Fly-off rounds may be compressed by consensus of the participants and the CD.

VINTAGE FAI POWER Low stress format

DAWN P-30

Sunday morning 7:30 – 7:50 AM launch window, one flight, no max.

TEXACO (Timer can ride with contestant)

1/2A Texaco: Saturday 7:00-10:00 AM launch window, 8cc fuel; Full Size Texaco: Sunday 6:00-10:00 AM launch window, 1/4oz per pound – max 1.75oz fuel.




