

The rules for the A-6 AMA event specify a very small indoor stick model that is easy to build and fun to fly. The A-6 event was developed by the San Diego Orbiteers club. Long-time club member Clarence Mather said in a letter to Roger Schroeder that the A-6 was developed as a small, sturdy, and easy-to-build model that could be flown in a small recreation center gym after club meetings. The A-6 model is limited to a maximum wing area of 30 square inches, a solid wood motor stick measuring 6-inches maximum from the front of the thrust bearing to the rear hook, and a maximum prop diameter of 6-inches. The "A" in A-6 stands for the old AMA class A model that had a wing area limited to 30-square inches. My guess is that the "6" in A-6 refers to the maximum motor stick length and/or the maximum prop diameter. All framing in an A-6 model must be 1/16-inch square wood minimum except that the ribs can be made of 1/32-inch x 1/6-inch minimum wood. There is no limit on the stab size so tandems are allowed. There is no overall length limit on the A-6 model. Covering can be "paper or commercially available plastic." The prop blades must be made of 1/32-inch minimum thickness flat balsa wood. Wing posts can be rounded in the area of the mounting tubes. The minimum allowed weight of an A-6 is 1.2 grams, excluding the weight of the rubber motor. Boron, carbon fiber and foam cannot be used in constructing an A-6.

I built my first A-6 in 2006 based on the Combs plan. It had a drooped tail boom and used a 6-inch Ikara prop with plastic film blades, which was not legal. It weighed 5 grams. It flew steady and sure, but only for about 45 seconds.

My second A-6 was built in 2007 using a kit from Lew Gitlow. It had a high aspect ratio wing and a legal prop with flat 1/32-inch sheet balsa wood blades. I don't recall its weight but it was probably around 2-3 grams. I also don't recall its times but they were probably a little over one minute and perhaps as long as 2 minutes. It was hard to build near the 1.2-gram minim weight until around 2015 when plastic film covering was first allowed. I kept plugging away at this event and have now built nine A-6 models.



Bill Gowen holds all most of the AMA A-6 records with his droop stab tandem. The Cat IV AMA record for the A-6 class is over ten minutes. You will need some really light balsa wood to get near minimum wight if you build Gowen's design. I am not sure the weight of his very large stab is worth it since it does not provide as much lift as the wing. I don't think the design of the A-6 model is critical to winning most A-6 contests. Low model weight, optimum trim, matching rubber to prop, motor sizing, and winding are the keys to high times in the A-6 event. It is easier to build near the minimum allowed weight if an A-6 does not have a very high aspect ratio wing. The weight of relatively long wing spars probably offsets any advantage of a high aspect ratio wing.

As you get closer to the minimum model weight you can end up using a rubber motor loop that is more than double the hook-to-hook length. This invariably leads to rubber motor bunching problems including CG shifting and binding of the rubber motor against the motor stick late in a flight. I have tried using stir stick sleeves over both ends of the rubber motor and this strategy has so far had limited success.

I designed and built an A-6 with the same wing and stab proportions as my Limited Penny Planes which seem to fly pretty well. I call this design my LLP A-6. So far it has yet to break 2 minutes but I think this is due to poor trim rather than the configuration of the air frame.


I have had good success with another of my own A-6 designs which I call the Tipster. It has done over four minutes in the club's A-6 contests held in the Grossmont gym. My Tipster has gained weight and now struggles to do three and one-half minute flights. It now weighs around 1.7 grams. The plan for my Tipster A-6 is reproduced at the end of this article. I recommend increasing the height of the twin fins (rudders) by 25% in addition to that shown on the plan in order to avoid the minor Dutch roll of my Tipster. Unfortunately, as reproduced in this newsletter the plan is not to scale and there is no scale indicated on the plan. The wingspan of the Tipster is 13 1/8-inches and the stab span is 8 3/8-inches. Maybe you can adjust your copy machine to enlarge the plan to get these dimensions. My Tipster does not have a removable tail boom, which was added by Richard Wood when he drew up the plan. Only the lower ends of the wing posts can be rounded to fit into mounting tubes. The remainder must be 1/16-inch square.





Tipster A-6 by Mike Jester







