Our April monthly has been rescheduled to April 28, 2024. Events will be P-30, Glider (HL, CL & Tow) and Power (Gas/Electric). I'll be your CD, but the real organizer is Mike Pykelny our contest coordinator. Hope to see you all on the 28th. Hated to see the cancellation of the Scale Staffel Two Day originally scheduled for March 30-31. But the reason for my disappointment is rather self-centered. It's probably the first time that I haven't had to stay up until midnight to complete a plane for a special event. My Sky Bunny was finished by the Wednesday before the originally scheduled weekend contest. A first for me. Test glides and low power test flights showed the little Bunny may have some promise (i.e. won't turn to toothpicks in a full power flight). Keep your eyes out for a new announcement for the Scale Staffel two-day.



For those looking for some out-of-town competition there's the San Valeers 75th Annual, April 11-14 at Lost Hills. It's an America's Cup and National Cup event. So, expect some tough competition. The contest will have several events for "gummy band" flyers such as P-30, large and small Nostalgia Rubber, and Vintage Wakefield. There are also events for the glider guys including hand launch and catapult. In conjunction with the San Valeers event at Lost Hills, the SCAMPS/SCIFs will also have a contest at Lost Hills on April 13-14 that will include OT Large and Small Rubber Fuselage, OT Large and Small Stick and for those real old-time flyers a Twin Pusher Mass Launch. Even if you don't fly it still might be fun to watch. For those who are longing for some indoor flying why not take a road trip to the Round Dome in Eager Arizona. From April 19 -22 the Phoenix Model Airplane Club (PMAC) will be holding a contest at the dome that includes events such as Penny Plane, Limited Penny Plane, No Cal, Phantom Flash, Embryo and others. Check out the NFFS contest calendar to get a full description of all events. I'm sure there's an event for something in your free flight air force that's in the contest category list.

"We may be small in number, but we are mighty". It's been applied to sport teams, armies, and pygmy tribes. But now it has a special meaning for the Orbiteers. Our club now has two world champions in our ranks. Daniel Guo (yes, you've heard his name before in this column as US Junior Indoor Champ) who won the 2024 World Indoor Junior F1D Championship in Slavic Prahova, Romania and Yuan Kahn Lee who won the 2024 Indoor Senior F1D Championship also in Romania. By the way, this is Kang's third time as an indoor F1D champion. The USA Junior Team that Daniel was a member of placed second overall in the junior competition. The USA Senior F1D team placed first, as in they took it all! The dynamic duo of Guo and Kang was so hot it almost melted the underground salt mine (Europe's largest) they flew in. A free flight club would be proud to have one world champ in its fold and we Orbiteers are the home of two. Congratulations to Daniel and Kang and way-to-go USA!

For those of you who decided to try the corned beef and cabbage recipe I provided in the March column, I hope you had good results. Mine turned out pretty good and was enjoyed for several days. 2024 F1D World Championships

Daniel Guo, a Junior member of our club, won the 2024 Junior F1D world championship last month in the huge salt mine in Slavic, Romania. He was coached in the F1D event by Senior Club member Kang Lee. I have never encountered a young flier with more skill and determination. I coached Daniel in the Science Olympiad Flight event last year and he won first place at the National Tournament in Division B for middle school students. At that tournament he had an amazing time of 4:11 (251 seconds) with an 8-gram airplane and a 2-gram rubber motor! When Daniel decided to compete in the F1D event with a model larger in dimensions but weighing only 1.4 grams and using merely a 0.4-gram rubber motor, it was time for me to hand off coaching to Kang, a two-time world F1D champion. Kang won this third Senior F1D world championship last month at the same contest.

Under tremendous pressure, and challenging conditions, Daniel performed like a champion, with his two highest flight times being 26:31 and 26:38! The latter time is a new Junior Record. Kang's performance was also superb, with his two highest flight times being 28:57 and 29:41. His latter time may have set a new site record. 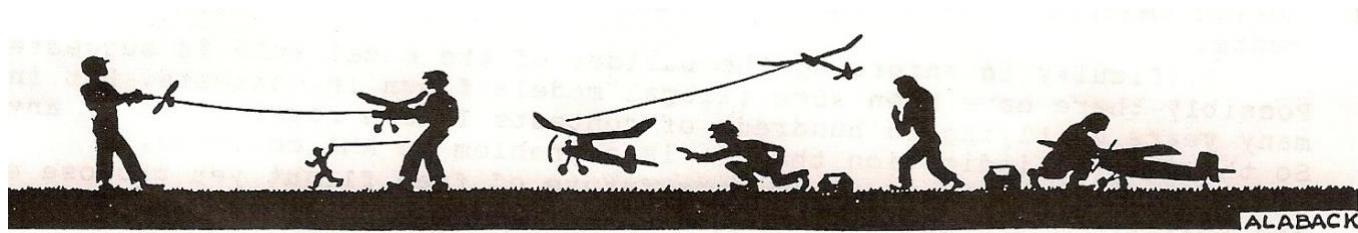


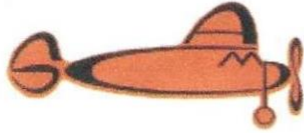

Modifications for DT okay as long as plan form is adhered to. No Scaling. For Catapult launch, a 9" loop of ¼" rubber may be used on a 6" stick (two 9" loops of 1/8" rubber may be used). Up to 9 launches for 3 two minute maxes. If you have 3 maxes, fly till you drop a flight.

**All Nostalgia Events, (10 Second Hand Launch, 13 Second VTO or ROG, then 7&9 seconds), 3 minute Max

*SAM Power events to be flown using SAM Rules. 20 Second engine run hand-launch, 25 seconds R.O.G. 5 Minute maxes: (weather permitting). Rubber ties will be broken by increasing Max times (weather permitting)

\$5 entry per event. Cash prizes 1st through 3rd, \$5 for each person you beat in the event.

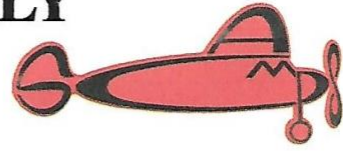
