Handle the FAA UA (drone) Regulations

The FAA has released several regulations that impact model airplane (Unmanned Aircraft) operation. A recreational flyer can comply with the requirements of 49 U.S.C. § 44809 in order to operate a UA without FAA certification or operating authority. The key to avoiding is to assure that all future flying is to be done for recreational purposes only. That is avoid falling under the requirements of 14 CFR part 107.

Their definition of UAS is; An unmanned aircraft system is an unmanned aircraft and the equipment necessary for the safe and efficient operation of that aircraft. An unmanned aircraft is a component of a UAS. It is defined by statute as an aircraft that is operated without the possibility of direct human intervention from within or on the aircraft. Direct human means the aircraft flyer has to be onboard the aircraft.

To fly recreationally, the law requires following these rules;

- (1) The aircraft is flown strictly for recreational purposes.
- (2) The aircraft is operated in accordance with the AMA's set of safety guidelines.
- (3) The aircraft is flown within the visual line of sight of the person operating the aircraft or a visual observer co-located and in direct communication with the operator.
- (4) The aircraft is operated in a manner that does not interfere with and gives way to any manned aircraft.
- (5) In airspace or within the lateral boundaries of the surface area of an airport, assure prior authorization from the Administrator or designee before operating and comply with all airspace restrictions and prohibitions.
- (6) In Class G airspace, the aircraft is flown from the surface to not more than 400 feet above ground level and complies with all airspace restrictions and prohibitions.
- (7) The operator has passed an aeronautical knowledge and safety test and maintains proof of test passage to be made available to the Administrator or law enforcement upon request.
- (8) The aircraft is registered and marked in accordance with regulations and proof of registration is made available to the Administrator or a designee of the Administrator or law enforcement upon request.

Also;

We must register UA weighing more than 0.55 pounds (250 grams) at takeoff including those used in limited recreational operations.

If you have small UA weighing more than 0.55 pounds (250 grams) that will be flown exclusively in limited recreational operations, you may obtain a single registration number for multiple UA by registering under part 48.

It will get worse; All UA requiring registration (i.e., those weighing more than 0.55 lb) including those flown for recreation must be operated in accordance with the Remote ID rule beginning September 16, 2023.

SHOW AND TELL:




