NFFS Hall of Fame Application Nomination Form and Instructions

Purpose: The NFFS Hall of Fame award recognizes aeromodellers whose contributions to model aviation over the years have been outstanding and have improved the sport/hobby and increased its prestige and stature.

Induction into the NFFS Hall of Fame occurs annually. Selection is based on the individual's contributions to model aviation, which may include competition, design, experimentation, leadership, education, organization, writing, publishing, manufacturing, or other related activities. Emphasis is on the accumulated contributions in one or more of these categories over an extended period of time. The program is administered by the NFFS. The selection of inductees is determined by the Hall of Fame Selection Committee, which is composed of the Hall of Fame Committee Chairperson and selected committee Members.

Rules and Procedures: Below are the rules and procedures that you should follow. Study them carefully and make the nomination as complete as possible.

Eligibility: Membership in the NFFS is not a requirement to be eligible for the NFFS Hall of Fame. A person is eligible for nomination if he or she has made the kinds of contributions listed in the "Purpose" statement above. The candidate may be living or deceased.

Nomination: Sponsors submit applications to the NFFS Hall of Fame Committee Chair who distributes them to the committee members for consideration

Important Date: Applications must be received by March 1.

Announcement and Presentation: Announcements of Hall of Fame inductees will be made in the NFFS Symposium. Sponsors and inductees are notified before the general public. Presentation of the awards will be made at an appropriate model aviation-related event.

Sponsor Instructions: Please read all instructions carefully. Following are the rules and procedures. Please be sure to follow all rules carefully since applications may be rejected if not completed properly.

Application: The NFFS Hall of Fame application will need to include the following:

- All info forwarded to the Committee Chair should be in digital format. No actual signatures are required (e-mail signature is sufficient).
- No more than four standard pages of biographical information. Letters of Support (minimum of three) should be included and are considered a part of these four pages.
- No more than two single sided pages of photographs.

Tips (read carefully): The total number of pages received by NFFS should not be more than seven. Any letters of support not included with the original application may not be considered as part of the original application.

The information provided should focus on how the candidate has contributed to model aviation overall, including specific examples. The information provided must be typed for easy reading by the selectors. Be brief but be accurate. Remember that sometimes less is more. Last, any application received after March 1 will be rejected and returned.

Voting Process: All applications are e-mailed to the committee by the chairperson. Nominees are discussed and voted on by the committee. Nominees selected will be forwarded to the NFFS President who forwards them by April 1 to the Symposium Editor for publication.
